### NSS SPECIAL CAMP (SESSION-2020-21) ABHAYAPURI COLLEGE UNIT

VENUE: 533 NO. HARIPUR-BOWALIMARI PRIMARY SCHOOL

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Abhayapuri College, a leading educational institution in Bongaigaon district, Assam organized a week-long special camp from **4th May 2022 to 10th May, 2022** at 533 No. Haripur-Bowalimari L.P. School this year. During the seven-day camp, the volunteers of the group conducted yoga, labour, teaching to local children, various awareness meeting and trainings everyday and at the end of the day, the volunteers had a cultural exchange with the villagers. **On the first day of the camp** i.e., May 4, the volunteers of the college conducted an awareness procession starting from the college to the 533 No. Haripur-Bowalimari L.P. School. They had cleaned the school campus as soon as they arrived. Soon after that the volunteers conducted a survey on "Technical literacy"- under the supervision of NSS Program Officers: Dr. Nabajit Majumdar and Dr. Pangkhi Hazarika respectively and invited the villagers for the awareness meetings to be held at the camp.

On the second day of the camp, May 5, the volunteers and the students of the school did yoga and physical exercises together in the morning. The flag of the Rashtriya Seva Yojana was hoisted by the Principal of 533 No. Haripur Bowalimari Primary School at 9 am. Afterwards, the volunteers cleaned the school premises. During the day, some volunteers also participated in school teaching programmes. After lunch, an awareness meeting on environmental awareness was held at 2 pm. The meeting was attended by Dr. Subrata Sarkar, Associate Professor, Department of Botany, Abhayapuri College. He also discussed the issue with the villagers. At the end of the day, a cultural program was organized to develop the talents of the village children. Children sing, dance, recite, etc.

On the third day of the camp, May 6, the volunteers and the students of the school did yoga and physical exercises together in the morning. The volunteers then cleaned the front of the school. During the day, some volunteers also participated in school teaching programmes. After lunch, an awareness meeting on the benefits of indigenous food was held at 2 pm. The meeting was attended by Dr. Ashok Kumar Das, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, Abhayapuri College and Mr. Dharam Ranjan Roy, correspondent of Assamese Pratidin newspaper. They also discussed the issue with the villagers. The cultural program at the end of the day included songs, dances and recitations by local children.

On the fourth day of the camp i.e., May 7, the volunteers and the students of the school did yoga and physical exercises together in the morning. The volunteers then cleaned up around the school. During the day, some volunteers also participated in school teaching programmes. Director General, Rashtriya Seva Yojana, North East Region, Mr. Deepak Kumar visited the special camp on this day. In the presence of the Principal of Abhayapuri College and some of the teachers of the college, Mr. Kumar delivered a lecture on the importance of Rashtriya Seva Yojana and the role of volunteers. In the evening, an awareness meeting on agriculture was held. The meeting was attended by Mr. Paresh Roy, Sub-Divisional Agriculture Officer, Uttar Shalmara as a resource person. He overviewed the important aspects of agriculture. He informed the villagers about various facilities related to the agriculture department. The villagers asked him various questions related to agriculture and he gave satisfactory answers. The cultural program at the end of the day included songs, dances and recitations by local children.

On the fifth day of the camp, May 8, the volunteers and the students of the school did yoga and physical exercises together in the morning. Afterwards, the volunteers went to clean the premises of Sri Sri Ladua Gopal Satra at Haripuri. In the afternoon, a drawing competition was organized among the students of the school. The meeting was attended by Mukuta Majumdar and Jayshree Chowdhury, advocates of Bongaigaon District Legal Services Authority as resource persons respectively. They gave an informative lecture on laws that the villagers are not aware of. They also discussed various legal issues with the villagers. After the last cultural programme, a Tug-of-war competition was held among the village women.

On the sixth day of the camp, May 9, the volunteers and the students of the school did yoga and physical exercises together in the morning. The volunteers then cleaned the Jagannath temple at Bowalimari. During the day, some volunteers also participated in school teaching programmes. After lunch, an awareness meeting on child health and women's empowerment was held at 2 pm. The meeting was attended by Dr. Sajidul Islam, Pediatrician, Abhayapuri Public Health Center and Prof. Suriti Brahma Chowdhury, Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, Abhayapuri College. They gave important lectures on their respective subjects. Soon after, a swimming competition was organized among the local children.

On the seventh and final day of the camp, yoga and physical exercises are conducted as usual. Afterwards, the classrooms and the premises of the school were cleaned up. A series of

training programs on disaster precautions were conducted from 11 am. The training was conducted by Mr. Utpal Bhuyan and Mr. Amar Shah of Civil Defense Department, Bongaigaon District. The training was attended by volunteers and school students as well as villagers. The Final Closing Ceremony of the seven-day camp was held at around 4 pm followed by a cultural program was held. The event was moderated by Dr. Nabajit Majumdar and Dr. Pankhi Hazarika respectively. The Guests of Honor were- Dr. Sadananda Nath, Principal of Abhayapuri College, Sarayu Devi, a Former Professor and Sri Naresh Chandra Sarkar, a theater actor of Abhayapuri College. Among the Senior Professors of Abhayapuri College- Prof. Suriti Brahma Chowdhury and Dr. Rajesh Tiwari were present. The event was also attended by the former and current volunteers of NSS and the villagers of Haripur-Bowalimari, Assistant Professor- Sri Bikram Ranjan Roy of Abhayapuri College and Journalist, Sri Dharam Ranjan Roy of Assamese Pratidin newspaper were also present. The students and women folks of the village won prizes in various competitions organized by the Rashtriya Seva Yojana (NSS) during the seven-day camp, the prizes were awarded by the invited guests. Among the Participants with exceptional performance the Thiyo-Naam Group of Haripur and the Diha Naam group of Bowalimari were noteworthy. The children and villagers of the two villages actively participated in the cultural programme. The event was also attended by former and current volunteers of the Rashtriya Seva Yojana. The camp ended successfully on May 10, 2022 with a vote of thanks from Dr. Nabajit Mazumdar, P.O. NSS, Abhayapuri College Unit.
