The main objective of the college is to produce graduates fit for the modern competitive world. So, the college has been trying to make the students skill through different career oriented programmes. To impart extension education is also one of the important objectives of the college. The institution always encourages the students to participate in various sports and cultural events, and extension works; it also imparts value education and education of civic responsibility for all-round development of the students. Thus the college has been working to achieve its ultimate goal of developing the society by imparting education in different fields in different modes.

During the year of 2009-10, the college has conducted 03 interdepartmental seminars, 03 community-related and 03 health-related programmes. The college has encouraged its faculty members to participate in different faculty development programmes and research works. This year 36 faculty members have participated in different FDP (OC/RC/Seminar/Workshop), 07 faculty members have been pursuing Ph.D. research and 05 teachers have been doing their M. Phil. The NCC unit of the college has facilitated the placement of its cadets in defense services. The infrastructure facility of the college has been expended adding 02 Assam type buildings and 01 bi-cycle stand for the girl students. The internet facility has been also extended. - A bi-cycle stand shade with iron stands has been constructed with the finance from the development fund of the college.
