The main objective of the college is to produce graduates fit for the modern competitive world. So, the college has been trying to make the students skill through different career oriented programmes. To impart extension education is also one of the important objectives of the college. The institution always encourages the students to participate in various sports and cultural events, and extension works; it also imparts value education and education of civic responsibility for all-round development of the students. Thus the college has been working to achieve its ultimate goal of developing the society by imparting education in different fields in different modes.

During the year 2010-11, the college conducted 05 interdepartmental seminars, 41 other seminars, 04 community service related programmes, 03 health-related programmes. The college has encouraged the faculty members to participate in different faculty development programmes and research works. This year 47 such programmes were participated by the faculty members. Again, 08 teachers have been pursuing their Ph.D. research. The NCC unit has facilitated the placement of its cadets in defense services. The infrastructure facility of the college has been expanded by extending the girls' common room, completing the 2nd floor of the R.C.C. building and installing a transformer in the college premises. The access to internet facility has been improved. A good no. of books, along with some other necessary items have been added to the Central library. Besides, the college has conducted a number of programmes to inculcate value education and the sense of civic responsibility among the students.

Thus, the college has made endeavors to achieve its goals and objectives.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):-

The college has decided to introduce Computer Science and Bio-Technology from the next academic year and has received necessary permission from G.U. to open Computer Science. It is hoped that G.U. will accord necessary permission to open Bio-Technology also in the next session.
